POINTS OF INTEREST

SCHOLARSHIP AND NATRC:

More than a year ago Georgia Boulton surprised all of us at the Convention in Grand Junction with the offer to donate the money to establish a Scholarship Loan Fund. After much work, we now have a Foundation established and have acquired the IRS 501 (c)3 tax status. With this in mind, National is now proud to offer money to students in two areas. The money donated from Georgia Boulton goes to establish the Steven Boulton Memorial Scholarship Loan Fund which is available to students pursuing a degree in Veterinary Medicine. The NATRC Board, encouraged by Georgia's generosity, established an NATRC Scholarship Loan Fund which is available to students pursuing a degree in Animal Nutrition, Reproduction, Science or other animal related studies other than Veterinary Medicine.

The loans must be paid back, but only after you leave school and then at 3 percent interest. Anyone interested in applying for either of these loans should contact Chere Barger at the NATRC main office for forms or further information.

Now for the Nuts and Bolts. Without money we don't have a Loan Fund. At the present, there is only \$125.00 in the NATRC Loan Fund, \$100.00 seed money from NATRC and a \$25.00 donation. I really want to appeal to everyone to send their contributions. The more money in the fund the more help we can be to the students. Please seriously consider this and if it is important, we now have the 501 (c)3 tax status. Check with your accountant to see how this affects you.

LETTER TO EDITOR

Here's my unofficial report of the IAHA ride (National Championship) near Payson, Utah on July 29 and 30. Camp was at beautiful Blackhawk campground with campsites in aspens around grassy meadow at about 8,500 feet elevation. Trails were well defined plus some jeep roads all with generally moderate grades. Distance was 35 miles each day with just over six hours riding time. There was a lot of trotting, but terrain and trails permitted it. Sixty-two horses started, fifty-one completed. A well managed ride with excellent and adequate P&R crews, three vet judges. Lots of emphasis was on low P&R's with 10-3 the maximum.

Thirty-five (my count) Region III riders competed with over half from Utah. Riders came from as far as California and even Pennsylvania.

All "finishers" received beautiful bronze belt buckles plus a certificate from IAHA.

The more rides I either work or ride, the more I feel we need to get our trails marked uniformly. On one ride it is hard for a rider to get lost, then maybe the next one it is difficult to find one's way back to camp. I realize that there has been some unfortunate circumstances where ribbons have been removed. I do not have a remedy for this. I have noticed on a lot of trails, there were not enough ribbons on roads. As a rider, following roads when there are no ribbons for a considerable distance, I get a very uneasy feeling that perhaps I have missed a turn. So I would like to see roads marked a lot better. The roads should have as many ribbons as any other open space.

Another item; the map, I know that topographical maps are much more accurate than a hand drawn one. A hand drawn map generally does not give true perspective. The roads, streams, and altitudes are not noted as on a topographical map.

We do need five or six mileage points with markers. Such as (A-B) or (1-2) etc., possibly on paper plates.

Ride management must be educated, I strongly suggest that they read all literature sent to them by Region III and NATRC. It would be very beneficial for you to work a ride.

Could you use help on your ride? I would be willing to put on a ride manager's clinic in the early Spring. Let me know!--Violet Peek
