
#### VERIFYING POINTS & MILEAGE

He was only a Christmas ponys. That I wanted as a child with silken mane and coat of ember gray.


He always walked with solumn steps without my prod or beckon But eventually always ending in the hay.

#### DO YOU KNOW YOUR FELLOW COMPETITOR?

This rider was born in Hanover, New Hampshire. Spent a good portion of This rider was born in Hanover, New Hampshire. Spent a good portion of her growing-up years at her grandparents dairy farm in Vermont. Attended the University of New Hampshire and graduated with a B.A. in Sociology. While working in Boston, as a Social Caseworker for Cambridge Welfare Dept. she met her husband-to-be....a third-year medical student at Tufts. They were married in 1967 and moved to San Francisco, where she worked for the Oakland Welfare Dept., while her husband interned at Mt. Zion Hospital. During the Viet Nam war, her husband was drafted by the U.S. Public Health During the Viet Nam war, her husband was drafted by the U.S. Public Health Service and was assigned to the U.S. Federal Penitentiary at McNeil Island, in Washington state, which was thirty minutes to the mainland by boat. During this two-year period, she obtained a Masters Degree in Social Work in 1970 from the University of Washington in Seattle. Leaving the gray skies and drizzle of Washington, they moved to sunny Albuquerque, where her husband finished his medical residency. Here they met Bill and Judy Cumberworth, as Bill was also a resident at Bernillo County Medical Center. Under Judy's "tutoridge", she learned more about horses, and purchased her first horse, Redsky. After the residency, they moved to Taos, where her husband started his medical practice, and she went into the horse business ...boarding horses. In 1975 they bought their first Arabian mare, now they have 20 Al Khamsa Arabian horses, which trace back in all lines to the original Bedouin Arabian bloodstock. They are extremely rare and now have their own directory. have their own directory.

Our rider started attending and working rides in 1975, and in 1981 she and her daughter rode their first NATRC Ride....Navajo Lake. She has two daughters, and they with Mom & Dad are now all enthusiastic NATRC boosters and riders. They have managed the Taos NATRC Ride for three years. This year they started their first Al Khamsa, bred, born and raised on their farm in competitive trail riding.

Breeding authentic Bedouin Arabians and participating in NATRC have been two highly complimentary activities, and our rider is happy to have an

two highly complimentary activities, and our rider is happy to have an "arena" such as NATRC to test the results of their breeding program. She is "back down on the farm" again, but.... "horseback riding is a lot more fun than milking cows!" she says

I. NATIONAL NATRO MEMBERSHIP is payable to the NATRO SECRETARY, P.O. Box 20315, El Cajon, California 92021. Phone: 619-58-TRAIL.

Family Membership - \$30 @ year (Husband, wife, children under 18) - 2 votes.

Senior Membership - \$25 @ year (Single adult-18 & over) - 1 vote. Junior Membership - \$15 @ year (under 18) - no vote.

Associate and Lifetime memberships available.

NATIONAL NATRC MEMBERSHIP is for 12 months from the date of joining, i.e. if you joined in April, 1985...your Nat'l. NATRC membership expires in April, 1986, and it should be renewed at that time. Membership application forms for NATIONAL NATRC may be found in the current NATRC Rule Book or on the back page of this Newsletter.

#### WHY JOIN NATIONAL NATRC?

- 1. You receive: (a) a \$3.00 Rider Fee discount on each NATRC Ride.
  - (b) the NATRC quarterly Newsletter "HOOFPRINTS" w/nat'l. & regional ride schedules, Ride write-ups, horse standings, and informative articles.

(c) a NATRC cloth patch.

- (d) voting privileges for your 3 Nat'l. Board of Directors from your Region.
- 2. You are eligible:
  - (a) to become a NATRC Board Member.
  - (b) to apply for Rider Mileage Chevrons (Open & Novice miles).
  - (c) to receive the 1000 Mile Plaque and subsequent 2000. 3000. etc. pendants.

(d) to purchase the 1000 Horse Mile Buckle.

- (e) to become a NATRC Horsemanship or Veterinarian Judge.
- (f) for Annual Year-End National and Regional Open Horse awards, Overall Horsemanship placings 1st through 6th in all classes (Heavyweight, Lightweight, and Junior), a National Championship buckle.

Family Membership - \$8.00 @ year (Husband, wife, & children under 18) - 2 votes.

Senior Membership - \$5.00 @ year (Single adult-18 & over) - 1 vote. Junior Membership - #3.00 @ year (under 18) - no vote.

REGION III MEMBERSHIP is based on the calendar year. January through December. All renewals are due no later than June 1st of the calendar year, otherwise a \$15.00 fee will be assessed before Year-End Points and Horse & Rider Mileage is tabulated. New members to NATIONAL NATRC should join REGION III as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of the last ride of the season, to be credited for mileage and points. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU KEEP YOUR NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP CURRENT TO REMAIN ELIGIBLE FOR ANNUAL YEAR-END HORSE/RIDER POINTS AND MILEAGE. You must be a NATIONAL NATRC MEMBER to be eligible to join REGION III!!!




