EASIER PASTE WORMING

By Susie Witter

About four months ago I adopted a two year old Anglo Arab filly. She didn't have much of a history of worming so an intensive worming program ensued. I started working with her mouth, touching and lightly massaging her lips, etc. as a precursor to paste worming. She progressed very nicely until she saw the tube and didn't want anything to do with it. She didn't try to leave the scene but her head wouldn't stay still. I started thinking about the situation and wanted something that was positive and easy for both of us. Here's what I came up with.

I mixed about six ounces of warm water with two to three tablespoons of molasses in a used plastic margarine container that had a lid. I found a small 3 cc syringe and off I went to the barn. I figured that the small syringe would be minimally invasive and easy to handle. I just laid it against her mouth and when she got semi quiet, I quietly turned it in to her mouth and squeezed. The first time or two might not be pretty but the idea is to get them to taste it. I did this 5-6 times and every time it was easier. I did this every day for a couple of days and then used the paste wormer.

Before I pasted her with the wormer, I used the 3 cc syringe two to three times to get a happy mindset. Then the wormer—with no problem. Then two to three more squirts of the molasses and water. The post paste wormer molasses encouraged her to swallow and I didn't have to worry about holding her head up until she did swallow.

This method worked so well on her that I tried it on my two adult horses. They love it! They have never been a problem but it wasn't high on their list of things to do. Now they stand eagerly waiting for the next squirt! A win-win for all of us!



Jim Ward seconded motion, AIF

Lin announced new members to the board: Jim Sinnett, Ginger Snip, Linda Adams, Cheri Westmoreland

Linell Miller, Carla Richardson, and Judy Mason are alternates

Lin is stepping down as President for Region 3 and nominated Jerry Sims to be new President. Vote was All In Favor!!! Welcome Jerry as our new President!!

Jr. Committee

Cheri Westmoreland is taking over Jr. Committee from Kay Gunckle. Kay did report that 4-H is showing more interest in clinics for competitive trail riding and that she is trying to contact the ladies she knows in 4-H that are working with this to give them info on our clinics.

Awards

Tracie Korthius is stepping down as award chair and this vacancy needs to be filled, and does not have to be a board member. This position HAS to be filled soon, before start of ride season. This years cost of awards was around 1300.00 which was less than last year.

Side Note: giving out awards to become board job, let different members hand out different awards instead of just the President doing it. (Laurie DiNatalie made mention that convention needs to be end of January to make getting year end awards done a little easier)

Ride Evaluations

Beth Sims is doing ride evaluations this year. Rule needs to be enforced that horse/rider can't check out until ride evaluation is turned in. Lin Ward had a friend create a very nice traveling plaque for each year's winner of "Best Ride Award". Leslie Lingle won for 2007 with her Spring Training CTR.

Treasurer Report

Kathy Shanor gave treasury report. All ride fees are caught up. Vest fees collected at rides have not been turned in and may be some confusion with ride managers on that issue in that they thought the money went to the ride. Laurie DiNatalie will get form that will show what is owed. Spring Training and Love of Horses CTR's have

been reimbursed for Jr. rider expenses (discounts). The annual ride book expenses were offset by advertising fees sold by Jerry Sims (thank you again Jerry) The actual cost was around \$636.00 for 500 books and around \$500 was made with advertising. We need to look at a supply replacement charge. We are running at about a \$1900.00 deficit for the year. New rider membership would help offset this loss. We do have funds in CD's that we can draw on if absolutely needed so there is an emergency cushion. Interest from these CD's is usually rolled back in.

- Discussion: Kathy may or may not be in CO as Mark is in Virginia. We may need new treasurer if Kathy moves.
- Jerry Sims motioned again to accept treasurer report.
- Jim Sinnett seconded motion. AIF
- (Side Note) There is no benefit ride this year. The silent auction will hopefully gain funds. National Convention funds will be split between region and national.

New Business

Kerry Bingham has requested that the Stirrup Newsletter be done on a Quarterly basis to make it easier on her and to save money with postage costs. We need to get as many people as possible to receive this via e-mail. We are also NOT going to charge members for ads in the letter. Stirrup will be done March, June, Sept., and Dec.

Motion was made to accept changes in doing newsletter on a quarterly basis and to not charge members for ads.

Doreen seconded the motion. AIF

Incentive Program

There has been an ad in the Hoof Print that Region 3 has paid for that gave the first 2 first time riders to see the ad, and use it, to get ½ off at a ride. Do we want to keep this? Majority was NO, will discontinue the ad.

Junior Riders

Junior riders, if members, get ½ off ride admission if doing 5 rides. Most rides have discounts, we are giving rides away if they get additional discounts. Jr. riders aren't our market. Do we keep the 5 rides with ½ off discount? Majority—NO.

Do we keep a no fee for Jr's with paying adult? Majority—NO.

Give a ONE RIDE discount up to \$20.00 if attending a clinic. Coupon's given at clinic for a ride of choice. The Board is covering these expenses, should it be at ride manager's expense? Jim Sinnett made motion that a \$20 discount be given to a clinic participant to a ride of their choice, during current ride season, with reimbursement coming to ride from clinic. Kay Gunckle seconded.

Discussion: Linda Adams said that she and Judd are considering managing one or two new rides in the future and if rides are losing money and the region's treasury is low, how is board going to keep having funds to reimburse for these expenses? Rides are going to have to charge more.

Motion was reviewed, Vote was NO

Side note: Susan Peters wants to waive a registration fee to her ride for a reporter from the Western Horseman magazine that wants to ride and do a report/article on the experience. Lin Ward made motion for board to pay fee for this person.

Web Site

Jerry Sims has noticed some areas that need correction on our R3 web site (I have as well) Ride list needs to be updated, otherwise, the web site looks good.

Publicity

Jim Ward is resigning from National advertising though he will continue to work with R3 advertising. He isn't happy with rule changes, certain actions of National Board. We've lost most all of our national sponsors due to lack of appreciation from board or members. He and Lin are sponsoring a year long raffle of a saddle; all proceeds after expenses will be given to region. Drawing will be held at next year's convention. (Board should write Dave to thank for his special pricing on saddle and contribution for our fund raising)

Membership/Mentor

Jerry Sims would like to see a more accurate count of our membership as different reports show different numbers. He and San Juan Trail Riders are working hard doing classroom and active clinics. Clinics should be held during the first part of ride season to try and get member #'s up. He and group are working with Jr. College that is allowing them class space and so far they've had 4 and may move to 5 as they are proving very popular. There is a need for a shared format of these classes so other areas can possibly start: how, what college has done for advertising, and college wants them to have more classes. Ride clinics will be held after class clinics. Doreen mentioned the possibility of having a clinic following a "B" ride to go over cards, riders have more first hand knowledge and can ask better questions. Jerry will put an article re the classes in the next newsletter.

Jerry wants the Friday night "cocktails & junk food" to continue at rides to make sure 1st time riders come and feel welcomed into our crowd. Ride management needs to make sure that green ribbons are given out to first time riders, put on riders, horse, trailer, anything so that we can recognize them and do more to check on them. Olga has made postcards to send out to first time riders after a ride.


